Importance of National Reporting

Article 13 (3) of the Basel Convention requires Parties to report information related to their implementation of the Convention. This is done annually and is due on December 31, each year.

2

Designate your National Focal Point

- Focal points are responsible for receiving and transmitting information as provided for in Articles 13 and 1.
- National reports are submitted to the Secretariat through the Focal Point.
- A Party may designate only one Focal Point.

3

Designate your Competent Authorities

- May be an entity/agency responsible for environmental protection/pollution control
- Has a key role in licensing entities engaged in transporting, collecting, generating and disposing of hazardous or other wastes
- Responsible for implementing the notification process for transboundary movement of hazardous or other wastes.

Accessing the Electronic Reporting System (ERS)

Accessing the Reporting Dashboard

- Scan this QR Code to access the Basel Convention Reporting Dashboard.
- The Reporting Dashboard hosts aggregated data from national reports, and facilitates analysis across different metrics like years, countries etc.
- The dashboard also generates visual representations of the data.
